





Subject : Evaluation of GAD Projects, Programs and Activities

We have evaluated and audited the appropriation and implementation of the Gender and Development (GAD) fund of the City for CY 2024 and observed that:

The utilization of Gender and Development (GAD) funds for CY 2024 registered 91.77 percent accomplishment of the P1.377 billion GAD programs and projects to address the objectives of the gender issues and concerns, through the implementation of 49 out of the targeted 54 GAD PPAs or 90.74 percent thereof.

Section 4 of PCW-DILG-DBM-NEDA joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) No. 2013-01 provides among others, that the Local Chief Executive give directive to the GAD Focal Point System to: a) provide technical assistance in the implementation of the GAD Plan Budget (GPB); b) monitor its implementation; c) ensure the preparation and submission of GAD Accomplishment Report; and d) consolidate reports on the implementation of the GPB.



In identifying GAD PPAs, the City prioritized for implementation of those PPAs that will address emerging and/or continuing gender issues and concerns. These were as follows:


- a. Provision of basic services and facilities to protect and fulfill women's human rights, including their right to protection from all forms of violence and discrimination;
- b. Women's economic empowerment including women's participation in economic governance; and
- c. Gender equality in all sectors of the community to achieve the vision of a gender-responsive society where men and women equally contribute to and benefit from City's development.

Our audit on the implementation of the CY 2024 GAD PPAs to address the City's gender issues and concerns showed that of the P1,376,619,810.00 appropriated amount of GAD PPAs, the amount of P1,263,387,445.75 or 91.77 percent were utilized/implemented. Validation on the implementation of GAD PPAs showed 90.74 percent or 49 out of the 54 targeted GAD PPAs for CY 2024 were fully implemented. The summary are as follows:

It is worthy to note that the CY 2024 GAD PPAs implementation rate of 90.74 percent is 9.38 percent higher than the CY 2023 implementation rate of 81.36 percent. The increase is attributed to the continuous coordination between concerned Offices during the planning phase to address the overlapping of PPAs. This resulted to an efficient and effective delivery of social services to the people of Taguig City.


We commend the Management for the high implementation rate of its planned programs, projects and activities for GAD and for prioritizing PPAs that will address City's gender issues and concerns.
